

# Documenting PRINT Sources for Works Cited

The content and formatting required for the most common print sources:

## **For a Book by One Author**

Last Name, First Name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Year.

Example: Smith, Fred. *World Hunger*. Greenhaven Publishing, 2015.

## **For a Book with Two Authors**

Last Name, First Name and First Name Last Name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Year.

Example: Baker, William and Mary Porter. *Causes of WW II*. Infobase Publishers, 2011.

## **For a Book with an Editor and no Author (such as an anthology or collection)**

Last Name, First Name, editor. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Year.

Example: Walker, Ross, ed. *Social Issues and Concerns*. Random House, 2014.

## **For a Book by a Corporate or Organization Author**

Name of the Company, Group or Organization. *Title of Book*. Publisher (if different than the name of the company, group or organization already provided), Year.

Example: National Research Council. *Forecasting World Population*. 2000.

## **For a Reference Article (such as from an encyclopedia)**

Author's Last Name, First Name (if any). "Article Title." *Encyclopedia Title*. Year.

Example: "Titanic." *World Book Encyclopedia*, 2008.

## **For A Magazine Article**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Article Title." *Title of Magazine*. Date: Page(s).

Example: "Future of Self-Driving Cars." *Time*. 3 May 2017: 72-75.

# Documenting ONLINE Sources for Works Cited

The content and formatting required for the most common online sources:

## **For Web Sites (such as found through Google or other search engine)**

Last Name, First Name. *Web Page Title*. Publisher or Organization. Date  
Posted or Updated. URL (web address). Accessed Date.

Example:

“Titanic.” History.com A&E. 2018. [www.history.com/topics/early-20th-century-us/titanic](http://www.history.com/topics/early-20th-century-us/titanic).  
12 September 2018.

## **For Database Articles (such as from EbscoHost, Facts on File, Jstor etc.)**

Last Name, First Name. “Article Title.” *Original Source (Magazine,  
Journal or Publication title)*. Volume Number. Date Published.  
*Database Name*. URL, DOI or Permalink\*. Accessed Date.

Example:

Sivaram, Varun. "The Global Warming Wild Card." *Scientific American*. Vol. 316.  
May 2017. EBSCOhost.

\* In place of the URL you may use a DOI (digital object identifier) or permalink as may be provided for some database articles. Look for a “share” or “cite this” link to see if a source includes a permalink.
