February 13, 2024 BOE Meeting Summary

President's Report

Mrs. Ginsburg updated the Board of Education (BoE) on the superintendent search. The Personnel Committee completed the first round of interviews of eighteen candidates. They are currently in the midst of second-round interviews with eight candidates. The Committee will narrow it down to two or three finalists who will be interviewed in early March. The BoE will host focus groups of staff and school-related organizations next week.

Mrs. Ginsberg also announced that the BoE and Town Council representatives will meet next week.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Phillips started his report by thanking the Glen Ridge Educational Foundation (GREF) for funding (\$85,000) the primary SEL program *Capturing Kids' Hearts*. The primary principals expect this thorough 2-year staff training program will improve the building climate and address student needs.

Mr. Phillips recognized the recent achievements of staff members and students.

Teachers:

- Shihong Zhang (GRHS Chinese) is receiving the "Excellence Award" from the Suburban Essex Chamber of Commerce for her dedication to the students and contributions to Chinese education.
- Maria Desipris (GRHS Spanish) has been accepted to participate in the GenEc Teacher Fellowship Program in Armenia this summer. She is 1 out of 15 nationwide teachers accepted into the program.

- Mr. Majewski took four teams (11 students) from The Middle School History Club Academic Team to Washington D.C., to compete in the Geography Nationals. Our top team went 7-1, losing in the championship match. The four teams included:

- This past weekend, 9th grader Jude Rothman's audition earned him a spot in the NJ Region 1 Concert Band. Jude received the highest score in North Jersey and will represent GRHS as 1st-chair euphonium in the Region Band concert in March!

Lastly, Mr. Phillips announced that Barbara Murphy, School Business Administrator, will present the tentative budget for the 2024-2025 school year at the March 5 BoE meeting. He encouraged people to view the <u>Budget Calendar</u> to learn more about the development of the budget.
